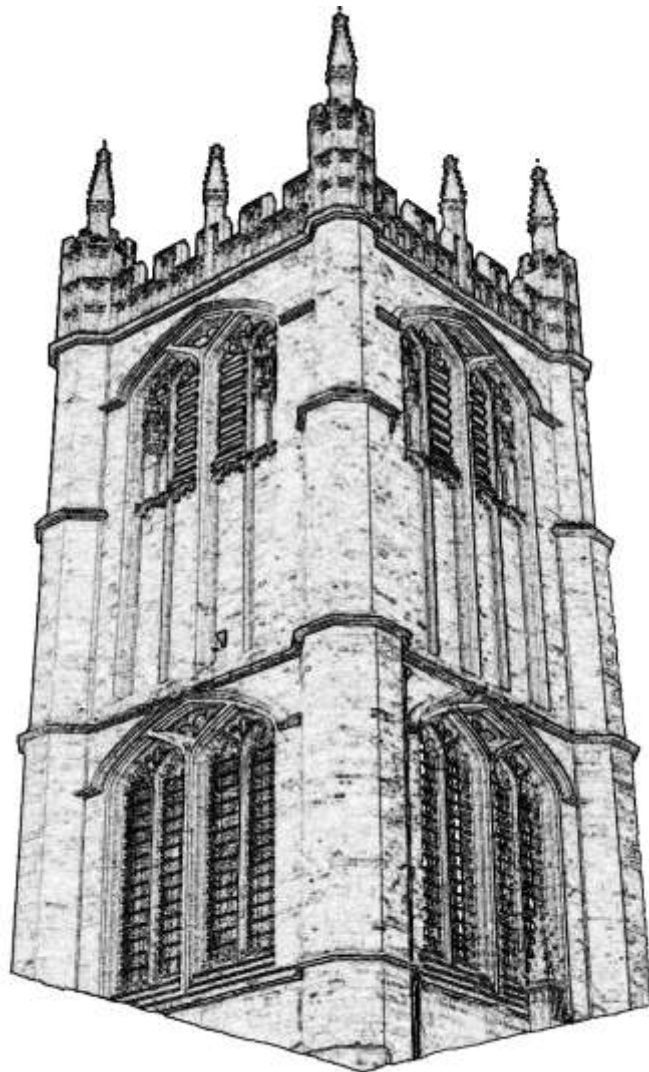

## CLERGY LETTER

Throughout the Easter season, I have been reading Paula Gooder's book "This Risen Existence". In her introduction she writes: "Resurrection is not complete, however, without the ascension and Pentecost. The death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus and the sending of the Holy Spirit all come together as a seamless whole. The progression is simple but vital. Jesus' death and resurrection transform us and allow us to become the people that God wants us to be, but the ascension and Pentecost are equally important. Ascension is one of those sadly overlooked feasts of the Church. Often we are not too sure how to celebrate it. If we ignore it, however, we lose a vital link in the chain that runs from Good Friday to Pentecost Sunday. The resurrection offers us transformation in Christ, the ascension gives us the motivation to act and Pentecost the ability to do it."

Mary Magdalene was transformed by love, and if we, too are to be transformed, and live an Easter faith, we must be open to the transforming power of the Holy Spirit. Like Mary Magdalene, we too must be ready to proclaim the Easter faith; we too must be ready and willing to be Christ's body here on earth. Each one of us has a special gift to offer, a special vocation, a special ministry, and it is the gift of the Holy Spirit that enables us to use our gifts.

In the coming months we look forward to welcoming a new Team Rector Designate, and sharing new and exciting opportunities truly to be an Easter people.

## FROM THE BISHOP

“No news is good news”, or maybe, “Good news is no news”.

It can certainly seem like that at times. But why? Perhaps it is in part because good actions are normal, everyday occurrences. We are used to them. They are not, in that sense, “news”.

Thankfully, the items which come on our television screens, out of the radio, down our computers and in the newspaper are usually there because they are rare and exceptional; not normal everyday occurrences.

So why do we focus quite so much on what is not normal and everyday?

St. Paul wrote to the Christians in Philippi telling them to think on all those things, which are just and true and honourable and good and commendable. Sound advice!

This is not to say that we should ignore the bad or, worse still, pretend it is not there. Far from it. But it is to say that we need more of a focus on “good news stories”, normal, everyday stories of good and kind actions.

What you and I focus upon with our thoughts and attention shapes how we develop, just as what we eat affects our physical health and well being.

So here are some good news items to focus on:

- Recently a further lorry load of medical and other supplies was sent from Hereford to the earthquake victims in Haiti. You probably sent money to them and those in Chile and still pray for them
- There are a huge number of people who care for ill or disabled family members day after day, pouring out love and kindness
- There was a night shelter in a church hall in Hereford for homeless people for many of the weeks of this very long, cold winter
- Food is provided for homeless people by many churches and individuals
- Just think of all the voluntary work undertaken by you and others whom you know in your congregations and villages
- And what about all the major national Charities like Samaritans, Christian Aid, Oxfam, Help the Aged, Breast Cancer Haven, and Hospices...

The list goes on and on and on. And so it should. It is all part of the outpouring of the goodness and love in each of us. We need to celebrate and rejoice in all that is good. It is part of the continuing flow of God’s risen love and life in us.

### MOTHERS UNION

At the March Meeting, we had a most interesting talk from Reverend Melia Cope. Melia told us her mother was Greek but that she was born in South Africa. She attended a Presbyterian Sunday School in Johannesburg. As she grew older, she felt drawn to the Anglican Church. She was trained as a Social Worker and for a time worked in Prisons. She came to England and eventually studied Theology and worked at the Industrial Mission in Worcester. She was ordained in Lichfield Cathedral. She is married to a retired priest and she has two step-children and two of her own. One of her step-children is training for Ordination. She is Vicar of Stokesay, living in Craven Arms and she is meeting people of other faiths, particularly Pakistani. In Craven Arms there is a good line of communication between Anglicans and Methodists.

At our Annual General Meeting, the treasurer told us that we raised £260.00 for overseas work in 2009. In 2008 we raised £300.00 for the “Away from it all Holiday” Scheme. Last summer a family of five from Ludlow had a lovely holiday.

### CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE

As some questions were asked at the Annual General Meeting (AGM) about how we include children and young people, and those who were recently confirmed in particular, it would be good to take the opportunity to explain in more detail. As many will have noticed, the junior choristers disappear during the sermon at the 9.30 am service. We go to the vestry where any other children and young people in the congregation join us. Some of those who were confirmed are now regular members of the group, and you will have noticed them taking part in the sermon on the first Sunday of the month.

We only have a short time in the vestry and we have to try (not always successfully!) to keep very quiet, but we are able to achieve quite a lot. Sometimes we talk about one of the Bible readings that day; sometimes we do a quiz or other game. We are usually looking ahead to the next presentation we will be doing, and often it is good to gather the children's own ideas to use in the sermon. Being able to rehearse what we are going to do the week before gives the children more confidence when speaking in church.

John Beesley is running a post confirmation group attended by a handful of children, on the third Sunday of the month after the 9.30 am service. Our aim is not so much to teach the children as to enable them to get to grips with the basis of our faith and what it means to lead a Christian life; I am always humbled by how knowledgeable and thoughtful they can be. We also have some good fun – that often leads to an increase in the volume!

We have been much encouraged by some positive feedback in recent months, so watch this space – there may be more in the months ahead – a listen out for the sermon on the first Sunday of the month!

I hope to arrange for future meetings to take place in the resident's sitting room at Clifton Court. As many Tower readers will know, it is a comfortable room, and,

of course Clifton Court is centrally located. We hope that it will be a more convenient meeting-place than houses which are scattered about the town. We hear the Bible in short extracts at our services. Bible study is apt to be bogged down in the discussion of small points, so that progress is slow. Our plan of action seeks to avoid the disadvantages of both by covering the ground at a pace that enables the general character of biblical documents to be appreciated. All being well, we shall begin the discussion of Exodus on 1 June, and seek to complete the book in three or four sessions.
